The California QSO Party 2007

We now know CQP 2007 was held at pretty close to the bottom of the sunspot cycle. The only way to tell by looking at the stats is the total number of QSOs was down. I can't wait to see what 2008 brings. Maybe the return of 10m and a chance to work everyone on five bands!

N6MJ operated W6YI to another first place finish. Just for those that are keeping track, this is Dan's fourth CA win.

The out of state 1st place finisher is VA7RR, operating at VE7SZ. Gary also holds the most first place finishes in state – six. Two to go, Dan.

The other major hallmark of 2007 is – lots of ops did something different. You'll see the usual ops listed in the scores pages but not in their usual places. Lots of new contesters were heard as well – welcome!

Everyone enjoyed the party and all are looking forward to 2008.

SINGLE OP RESULTS - CA

N6MJ, operating W6YI produced 2,581 QSOs for a total of 359,049. Dan had more PH than CW QSOs this year – in fact he took the most SSB QSOs prize as well.

The number two spot was filled by K6XX up from the number five spot. Bob turned in 2,224 QSOs for a total of 324,684 points. Clearly, Bob has his sights on that number one spot. Congrats on the great finish this year.

N6ED, operating K6NA again this year, had 2,303 QSOs for 319,656 with a third place finish, down one from last year. Craig was only able to find 57 mults this year.

The fourth and fifth spots finished a lot closer together. K6LA held onto fourth place with 2,297 QSOs for a score of 315,808. K2RD, operating AI6V finished with 2,287 QSOs and 315,462 points. Ira had 72 more PH QSOs than Ken and one more mult. That wasn't enough to overcome a deficit of 82 CW QSOs. Their scores differ by only 346 points. That's about 2 CW QSOs. Great operating guys. Oh, Ira set a new Nevada county record, previously held by AI6V in 1989.

AE6Y took top honors in the low power category with 1,422 QSO for 222,285 points, and 15th

place, overall. He'd not planned to operate LP. Equipment failure caused a change of plans.

K6AM took 2nd place LP with 1,365 QSOs and 203,205 points, finishing 17th overall. Third place LP goes to KM6Z at 903 QSOs and 134,973.

To get into the top CA twenty took a score of 185,716. This year that score was turned in by K6SRZ, back as a county expedition to Trinity as W6PZ. Welcome back Alan! Each op will receive a CQP vintage bottle of wine supplied by WK6I's Twisted Oak Winery. Score were down slightly from 2006.

SINGLE OP RESULTS – non CA

1st place finish goes to VA7RR, operating VE7SZ with 1,116 QSOs and a score of 148,654. W1UE (ex-NB1B) followed this with 977 QSOs and 135,227 which broke the existing MA record from 2002 (his). Third spot goes to N4PN at 916 QSOs and 125,831 points.

Making the top non-CA twenty took almost 72,000 points. Down just slightly from last year. Each op will receive a bottle of wine for their excellent operating!

MULTI-SINGLE -

Team K6VO drove over the top this year to take 1st place in the M/S category with 1,983 QSOs and 274,833 points. Frequent top finisher W6PT took 2nd this year with 1,818 QSOs and 256,272 points. This fine crew also operated as a county expedition.

Third place was nailed down by the W6JAZ crew (W7DR and K6XV). They provided 1,701 QSOs with 242,875 points and let the rest of North America know that Yuba County was on the air!

The MS category continues to gain in popularity with 31 entrants this year. MS is a great way to operate a county expedition. It's also a way to get someone new on the air and experience their first contesting – from the side that's "in demand".

MULTI-MULTI -

N6RO and crew managed N6O to another great 1st place MM finish with 3,505 QSOs and a score of 500,192. They weren't able to top last year's record though.

W6YX entered strictly MM this year, going all out to try and top N6O. They didn't quite make it with 3,149 QSOs and 439,089 points. Great job!

Coming in 3rd is a team from the Oregon coast that has taken over Del Norte County with 1,839 QSOs and 273,383 points. N6D was followed closely by the folks from central Oregon venturing down to MODOC. They used a different callsign this year – NE6LE. Perhaps that's what lead to a QSO count of 1,729 and a score of 252,039.

K6Z crew took 5th place, followed by W6A. Putting on a rare county expedition operating MM is a real test of commitment – thanks guys!

COUNTY EXPEDITIONS -

As always, county expeditions provided much needed coverage many counties. It's also a great way to repeat Field Day, 'cept with a rush of callers. This year saw two large Multi-Multi operations cover the most northern counties – Del Norte and Modoc.

N6D finally found all the right operating parameters to take 1st place in county expeditions, making 1,839 QSOs and 278,383 points. Congratulations guys!

Second place M/M goes to the perennial operation by the Central Oregon group, headed by K4XU with 1,729 QSOs and 252,039 points from Modoc County.

Third place for MM operation goes to the K6Z crew, organized by K6ZZ with 1,167 QSOs and 172,396 points.

First place M/S was again taken by W6PT from Imperial with 1,818 QSOs and 256,272 points. 2nd place goes to the N6RC team from Merced with 1,542 QSOs and 226,809 points. Dick ran a mix of new (N6KJ) and old (KX7M) with him this year. Great results for my buddy. Third place was taken by N6A, organized by W4UAT with 1,298 QSOs and 195,538 points.

Returning to Trinity county and CQP this year is K6SRZ, operating as W6PZ to take 1st place SO with 1,227 QSOs and 185,716 points. Glad to see you back in the 'test Alan. 2nd place goes to W6ML (op W6KC) in Mono with 1,164 QSOs and 173,880 points.

Several of the county operations this year had to contend with rain, snow, lightning and hail. We appreciate their desire to get these rare counties on the air.

SWEEPS -

You had to be on your game this year to sweep all counties. Several county operations didn't go as planned by the CQP staff. W1UE was the 1st to 58 at 00:23Z, working W6OT in YOLO county.

It wasn't till 14:16Z when the K6AQL mobile operation arrived in Colusa (the second time) that the 2nd to 58 was achieved by KO7X. K6AQL/M gave 10 more operators their 58th mult over about two hours. Most were on CW, but, Dave and crew were trying to "spread the luck as best as the bands would support".

KS5A/M provided the 58th mult for several more stations as from Tuolumne county. The last station to sweep was K0GSV at 21:43Z, working K6VMV in Tuolumne.

The rare county this year was Colusa. A total of 30 stations made a sweep this year. Congrats folks!

In-state sweeps seemed a little easier. Always the two difficult mults for CA ops is NT and NV. We all know the rarity of ops in VY1 territory. This year, VY1JA was joined by a new recruit – VY1WR. He did an excellent job, providing several 58th mults on Sunday. Welcome Bob and thanks for joining in.

The silver state was strongly represented by several ops, including W7RN (op K5RC) and N7TP. Of special note is Bruce, KT4ET. Bruce recently got back into Ham radio after recovery from a long illness. We look forward to NV being on more often.

First to 58 was W6TK at 20:24Z working AG1H from Kentucky. This sets a new record of 4 hours and 20 minutes, the old record was 21:04Z set in 2001. Dick's record could stand for a long time. Looking over his log, he should have gone out and bought a lottery ticket - no two! Of course, he was too busy making QSOs to go for the lottery ticket, coming in 9th overall. It must have thrilling to capture some of the harder mults early and realize he was setting a strong record. More amazingly, W6TK bested the N6O MM super station to 58 mults.

The 2nd station to work all 58 mults was of course N6O @ 00:20Z. KF6T then worked VY1JA @ 00:25Z for 3rd place. A few more stations works their 58th mult, then it was 14:50Z before any more 58th mults were worked. VY1WR began working 20M PH, giving the remaining stations their 58th mult.

N6D worked VY1WR at 21:51 as the last station to work all 58 mults.

The rare states/provinces this year were - NT, NV, and UT. There were 32 stations turning in a sweep this year.

RECORDS –

Many ops reported a number of first timers worked this year. W6OAT convinced his long time GA friend K6TKM (previously K4TKM) to come operate for awhile at his station. Brook had a great time and will be back. W6OAT also enticed his neighbor – W6ETM to join in the fun.

Welcome to all those new ops. CQP is a great way to get involved in contesting.

CQP is operated by a dedicated group of volunteers from NCCC, including AE6Y, WX5S, W6ZZZ, WA6O, WK6I, W0YK, KO6LU, K6RB, K6GT, AD6E, K6DGW, and K6UFO.

One of the hallmarks of CQP is the bottle of wine for the top 20 in state and top 20 out of state operators. Many of you look forward to that trophy. This wine is donated by Jeff Stai, WK6I. LOG CHECKING –

CQP operations continue to improve every year. Thru the skills of WA6O, we've had a web site going for three years now. This year, WX5S completely re-wrote the log cross checking software. This change allowed the log checkers to substantially improve their accuracy, while reducing the time needed on each log.

Our goal is to provide the best accuracy possible in these results. As always, nothing is perfect and there may be errors. Any error found after publication will be updated on the CQP web site:

We wish to recognize these ops as submitting a log, however, we weren't able to process the files – WI7F, KD3D, KG6OJV, AB2TC.

Any simple copying error such as wrong NR, wrong QTH, or wrong call was penalized by reducing the score by 1/2 of that QSO. Double copying errors (e.g. wrong call and wrong NR) or worse were penalized by removing the QSO. The team went to extremes find all QSOs.

My thanks go to the log checkers who put in many hours of effort to get these results out. Their efforts have made these results more credible. Anyone who submitted a "soft" log can get a report file that details each and every deduction. Please send your request to info@cqp.org
