Have you noticed how early the sun is setting, vearly 20m closes, and how chilly the nights are getting? Seems to me that's how it is at SS time. Yeah, SS is just a few weeks away now, after a very fast progression of DX contests last spring, FD in June, antenna erection parties all summer and our recent CQP bash. The fast pace of the clock has caught several of us(or just me?) with much antenna work, station equipment repair and checkout, etc., still to be done. Antenna projects, under WB6LPK's leadership, are still underway, and should any of you need help, HOLLER!

What are we facing in SS Club Competition this year? I bet that PVRC didn't like what we did to them last year, and I hear they'll be back with 150+ entries. Many new ambitious and talented contest clubs have sprung up since last November and all promise to be a threat: our SCCC neighbors to the south, TACO in Texas, Mad River (again), NECC - a spin-off from Murphy's. Our SS honcho, WB6CEP, has projected that we can pull off another #1 with about the same manpower as last year, but with bigger antennas, more erience, dedication and endurance on the part of all our members. Our more active stations all plan bigger and better efforts this year. Those of us who can't do the 24 hr per mode trip, how about 8-10 hours per mode? 100,000 points can

be generated by a very modest station with this kind of minimal operating commitment.

Our October 25 meeting will be a final PEP rally, with score projections, operating tips, band opening briefing, paperwork technique sessions. If like last year, it'll be an exciting, fun affair followed by the usual pizza and beer. Please bring a neighboring NCCCer who you know may have been somewhat inactive lately-help him turn on and turn in SS points.

Up until SS time, our Tue. Night (7:30PM) net on 3815 will feature a mini-SS on both modes to help sharpen your contesting technique, reel off SSB exchanges in a few microseconds, and check out your programmable keyer's rapid fire! Join in these practice KB sessions.

THE SUPER NEW KB-1000 AWARD

This yr there will be one and only one Club SS award. This award, according to the estimate of your Club officers and Area Coordinators, is attainable by 90% or more of the stations owned by members of the NCCC. To receive one of these classy looking certificates, however, the operator(s) have got to KICK BUTT. Chances are that your station can hack it—can you? What can you do in an all-out effort in SS?

The rules are simple. If the combined CW and PHONE QSO total of the station(s) you operated exceeds the magic number 1000, you've got it. Note that no distinction is made between single-op and multi-op scores for this award; if a multi-op makes over 1000 QSO's, all members of the multi-op team will receive certificates. Be a Butt-Kicker this November.
