#### AND NEXT ... ARRL DX

Everybody said a west coast club could never win the SS. We've already proved them wrong three times, probably four! Everybody now says a west coast club can never win a DX contest (that it happened years ago was simply a fluke). At the November meeting, the NCCC voted overwhelmingly to try to prove them wrong once again. Yep, the time has come to go for the kill; to invade that one last area the east coast clubs consider theirs inviolately.

Winning the ARRL DX Test is not going to be easy, and we're kidding ourselves if we think for a moment PVRC, FRC, YCCC, et al are going to let us take that title without a fight. The east coast gets all the multipliers, the east coast gets JA runs, the east coast has the big multis... We've heard all that before--and, unfortunately for us, most of it is true! PVRC amassed 120 million points last year--boggling by anybody's standards. Yet, even with all that going for them, the east coast is not unbeatable.

Look what we have going for us. We've got numbers--NCCC's membership now stands at 193. We've got good stations, too--true, they're not W3AU, W4BVV, W2PV, W1ZM etc., but they're certainly capable of turning in highly respectable scores. A few of them combined can match the score contribution of a W3AU. We've got a

An overwhelmingly enthusiastic response from the membership at the November meeting made it evident that the NCCC wants to make a major effort in the DX Competition next year. N6SF and myself have volunteered to work as co-chairman for the club effort, but we need your help with the contest coordination. Please contact either Rusty (885-6969) or myself (538-0520) ASAP if you want to help demoralize and destroy the competition on the East coast. Check out Rusty's article for more details.

club repeater, and more experience running spotting nets than anybody. We've got thousands of JAs to work. We've finally got European multipliers on 10 and 15 meters. And most importantly, we've got an incredible level of enthusiasm and the proven organizational ability to put together a club effort of this magnitude.

Most of you know the ARRL Test has been reduced to one weekend per mode (March 3-4 and 17-18). From the old two weekend contests, we know that roughly one third of the final score came from the first weekend. Based upon that, PVRC's record translates to 40 megapoints by 1979 standards. I suspect it will take about 50 M to win this year. That's 25 meg per mode. To put that in comprehensible terms, a megapoint score is 200 multipliers with 1,667 QSOs, or 250 multipliers and 1,334 QSOs. A half-a-meg score is 200/834 or 250/667. In addition to numerous single op and multi-singles, the NCCC has at least 25 stations capable of generating a million points each mode if operated as a multi-multi--and I don't mean as a W2PV type multi! I'm talking about the "mini-multi," two transmitters on the air simultaneously. With 10, 15 and 20 meters all wide open to JA, we can generate the necessary QSOs. With 10 and 15 open to Europe, and with two rigs searching and pouncing, we can get 200 to 250 multipliers. Further, with the 2m net in full swing, we can boost everybody's multiplier total by 20 to 25 with minimal effort. In short, we can win this thing!

What do we do to get ready? Our indefatigable VP-CC, Gary, WA6VEF, has volunteered to be chairperson for this effort. Several other members have agreed to act as area coordinators, or as special project coordinators. We are planning a program for the January meeting to share some closely-held station set-up secrets and operating tricks. We are organizing the 2 meter net. But to mount as massive an effort as this will take, we need your help. We need you to plan now to operate both modes of the test and to reserve those dates on your calendar. We need you to try to set up your station as a two (or even three) transmitter multi-multi if at all possible. We need you to get with your friends to be sure all stations are sufficiently staffed with operators. We need you to get on the WR6ADM repeater (147.84/.24). If you'll do that, Gary's gang can take care of the rest. If you're willing to volunteer as a coordinator, please call Gary (538-0520) or me (885-6969) and let us know of your availability for assignments. KB DX! WE CAN WIN!
