been initially included in this list, please contact me ASAP. Elections are in April, and that will be before we know it. The new officers and BoD have many challenges ahead of them.

Two awards programs were defined and approved. Beginning with this year's (1978) ARRL DX, engraved plaques will be awarded to the following club-high stations on each mode: a) Multi-single; b) Multi-multi; c) Single-op; d) Hi-band; and e) Low-band. (Also, don't forget to run those JA's for the 1978 NCCC JA/Band/Mode certificates.)

The second award decided upon is one to last each of us a lifetime and build upon. Initial achievement, or entry, will be awarded a Master NCCC Pin. Each additional achievement will be a device to attach onto the Master Pin or previous device. Achievement will be based on performance in each of four contests--ARRL DX, CQWW, All-Asian DX, and, of course, SS. The achievement level, or goal, will be defined before the appropriate contest, taking into account past performances and present conditions. All those members reaching or surpassing this goal (or others at the discretion of the BoD), will receive either the Master Pin and appropriate contest device (for first time) or only the appropriate contest device, if the member already has the Mas-This program will begin for all ter Pin. contests in 1978 and, consequently, the 1978 ARRL DX will be judged after-thefact. All other goals will be printed in the JUG prior to the contests.

The formal designs for the achievement pins have not been approved. Those of you with suggestions and/or artistic abilities, please submit your ideas quickly so that we can solicit bids on the molds. These will be castings, not plastic! After all, the BoD feels that if you are a member of a top-notch club, the awards should be top-notch, also.

We have a problem with our secondclass postal permit and may lose it due to some previously unknown requirements. In the event that we must revert to first-class postage (which most of you wanted anyway), the club dues may be raised slightly to cover this cost. The difference will cost the NCCC about \$250 per year.

Hope to see all of you at the March meeting--bring your scores, rate sheets, etc., from ARRL DX, and let's have some


