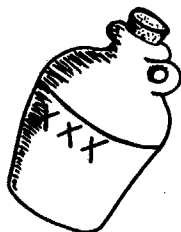

As most NCCers know by now, the club designated only three contests this year as MOE's to be sure we didn't spread ourselves too thin or burn ourselves (and our families) out. The idea was to limit major activity to a few events so we could plan operating schedules around them, push hard, and thereby insure a good club showing.

The first MOE is the Cal QSO Party on October 7th and 8th, and we're about to be put to the test to see if we can deliver. I talked a bit about this in my column last month, but I can't say the response has been overwhelming. It looks as if the usual group of stalwarts will be on, but it seems most of us are planning simply to let that weekend slide on by because of other things. Doesn't that raise some questions about the level of commitment to our club, and beg the question of why a few members should bust their rear ends to plan events for us when all they get in return are yawns of indifference? Is it really that difficult, or does it put us out that much, to get on the air for a couple of hours (and that's all that's needed in the CQP) to hand out a few contacts? Pity the poor East coast stations tuning thru a wall of W6's!! From the enthusiastic response for the CQP from testers/county hunters across the nation, sweepstakes may be coming a month early! Plan to get on: Oct 7th & 8th, 1800 UTC, (Full information/rules in September QST or contact 'DSV.) Get on and warm up for the real "SS".

This years contest will produce a number of DX-peditions to various counties. Some of the stations are: W6TPH, W6OKK, WB6RIU/m6, N6BT/m6, N6QW, N6CQ, AA6DX, K6PJY, WA6AVS, N6AU, N6RZ, N6KT, K6LL, WA6-HJV and K6CSL. Now that we know what these KBer's are doing, what are your plans, OM? Be prepared! Bring your plans for the CQP to the September meeting.

IMPORTANT! We will have a pre-contest rally/net at 1730 UTC (one half hour before the contest) on 7235 KHz, plus or minus QRM. Check into this pre-contest net for the latest in strategy and planning (let's all QSY to 15 meters together and warm up the ionosphere!)

Remember, we want to give the rest of the country a 'wall' of stations to listen for so be sure you get on and KB!



ADM ACCUMULATIONS

As a result of many generous donations from NCCC members and others, the Board of Directors has gone ahead and ordered a duplexer for WR6ADM-VHF. This gem, being purchased from Phelps-Dodge Communications, is costing the club a little over \$650. Thanks to the courtesy of P/D, we have sent them a down-payment of \$500, thus beginning the two month construction period required for the duplexer. However, this has all but depleted the club repeater fund, and when the time rolls around for us to pay the balance, we will be hard-pressed to do so, unless you, dear member, unfold your pocketbook and chip in for this worthwhile cause.

Aside from the duplexer, the repeater has other expenses which need attention. The current antenna, a Hustler G6-144, is doing an admirable job, but it is the feeling of the majority of the club that, in order to perform at tip-top condition, the repeater should have a commercial antenna of the fiberglass variety. This will cost over \$150, but, unlike our present antenna will not corrode away with time.

The repeater, being of the thermionic valve variety, also needs an occasional tube or two. Up to now, certain members have chipped in from personal stockpiles. We are deeply grateful to these fine, upstanding citizens, but we cannot expect them to continue in this fashion. If you have one or more of the tubes listed below lying around, in good condition, please bring them to the next meeting, or if you dare, mail them to N6KB. If you have a source or feel compelled to purchase some, please feel free to do so; any donations will be gladly accepted.

WR6ADM will play a valuable part in club affairs, both during contests (for spotting nets), and during everyday operations, being a much needed source of inter-club communication. If you have not already done so, equip your station to take advantage of this fine machine. It's frequency pair is 147.84/.24. See you there!
