PETE'S PLACE

1980 ARRL DX CONTEST: CW:February 16-17 Phone:March 1-2

This year will be our second all-out effort in the ARRL DX Contest club competition, unlimited class. Last year, on our first attempt in this contest, the club produced an excellent effort which put us in second place nationally.

This was the first time in many years that a west coast club has done that well I don't know of a West Coast club winning first place in recent history, and I doubt that it has ever occurred.

With the sun-spot cycle nearing its peak and our experience from last year, the time is right for us to put forth a winning effort. Last year our average score per entry was .61 million points with 107 entries(CW and Phone). Frankfort Radio Club beat us with an average score of .66 million points and 126 entries. On an average score per entry basis they only beat us by 8%, the bulk of the score difference resulting from their larger number of entries.

To beat the East Coast clubs will require a dedicated effort by all of our members but I believe it is acheivable if we make a good, well planned effort. Acheiving this goal will be a lot of work, but also a lot of fun, as well as a very prestigeous acheivement which we can be proud of as a club and as individual contributors to the effort.

To maximize our club score, we mus make sure all our well to moderately well equipped stations are on the air in full KB fashion. We must distribute our operators among these stations so as to produce the highest average score per available operator. Considering our available station and operator resources, this is best acheived by putting on a sizeable number of small multimulti stations where practical.

The scores from these small multimulti stations may not look impressive in the national listings in QST, but they will look impressive on our club score tabulation, and give our score a big boost.

Where multi-multi is impractical or impossible, single-operator type stations are best utilized in the multi-single class with one or two operators. This class of operation with a KB effort and the two meter net can produce a high average score per operator even with a moderately equipped station.

This year the ARRL test rules have beed changed to a form which somewhat resembles the CQ Worldwide Contest. Se QST December 1979 for complete details. The major differences are that DX to DX contacts are now allowed with 2 points per QSO, DX to W-VE contacts count 3 points. Multipliers will be the number of countries worked. Entry classifications are the same except for band entry classes which are now single band or all band.

The effects of these rule changes are difficult to predict, but it seems likely that they will not seriously change our competitive position with the East Coast. One class that could, however, seriously hurt our club effort i the single band class. Single band scores will be way below those acheivable with all band operation, therefore we must discourage our members from entering that category. A large number of single band entries could seriously reduce our score. So pleaseplease avoid the temptation to enter the single band class.
