The BoD has voted in favor of NCCC sponsoring a trophy for the ARRL DX contest, to be awarded to the highest scoring single-op Japanese entry, both modes combined. The award will cost approximately \$30 per year; it will also increase the prestigue ar prominence of NCCC in Japan. Happy to see a good turnout for the CW weekend. It seems that Murphy gave us a double whammy, with the worst weather of the year, plus an ionospheric disturbance on Friday and Saturday. The high winds kept many antennas at low levels, and a few were lost in the more exposed areas. Scores were down from what we expected, primarily due to lack of QSO volume. On multipliers, many stations did as well as, or perhaps better than, last year. The QSO volume was certainly lower due to the poor conditions and perhaps partially due to the contest rules change. Let's hope that the poor propagation and rules changes had an equally bad effect on the East Coast.

Operation of the Two Meter Net was excellent, so if you weren't making use of it, be sure to do so for the Phone weekend. Looking forward to the Phone weekend, conditions should be good, as probability of an ionospheric disturbance and terrible weather on both weekends has to be low. Let's get started at solving some of the station problems that occurred this weekend, and get everyone on for a real KB effort on Phone. Don't be discouraged by the CW results, as our competators may have had equally bad problems.

### AWARDS FOR ARRL DX CONTEST

NCCC will now offer awards for top scorers in the ARRL DX Test. Highest score for each mode will receive a trophy in each of the four categories listed below. Also, each station and operators of multi-op stations acheiving target scores indicated below will receive certificates.

500,000 points Single Op: Multi-Single:1.5 Million

2 Transmitter Multi:1.5 Million Unlimited Multi-Multi:2.0 Million

Presentation will be made later in the year at the Xmas banquet or other social event. So if you're into awards, put in that extra effort -- you'll be rewarded and the club score will grow.
