

US. LET'S NOT PUT NOBV ON THE TROPHY YET. REMEMBER, THERE IS ALSO A TROPHY FOR THE TOP SCORING DXPEDITION TYPE STATION, SO PICK YOUR COUNTY AND TAKE A RUN AT THE TROPHY. A NEW RULE THIS YEAR ALLOWS 3 POINTS FOR A CW CONTACT AND 2 POINTS FOR PHONE CONTACTS. COMPLETE RULES WERE IN THE AUGUST JUG, AND DENNIS, NOW CAN ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS. OUR SUGGESTED 21 MHZ SSB FREQUENCY OF 21,355 COINCIDES WITH THE AFRICANA DX NET AND SHOULD BE AVOIDED BY ±5 KHZ WHEN THEY ARE OPERATING. OUR OBJECTIVE IS TO HAVE CA STATIONS OPERATING EVERY 3 KHZ OVER THE WHOLE BAND ANYWAY.

LAST WEEK DURING THE FRANKFORD CLUB QSO PARTY THEIR MEMBERS COULD BE HEARD STRUGGLING TO REACH THE 50 QSO'S THAT WOULD EARN A CERTIFICATE. LAST YEAR WE HAD 29 STATIONS WITH BETWEEN 500 AND 2040 QSO'S. MAKES YOU PROUD TO BE AN NCCC'ER.

THE SS ORGANIZATION IS SHAPING UP UNDER THE DIRECTION OF VP/CC, N6TV.

OUR POLICY THIS YEAR WILL BE TO GENERATE AS MUCH ENTHUSIASM AS POSSIBLE AND TO ATTEMPT TO FIND A STATION FOR EVERY ONE WHO WISHES TO PARTICIPATE, BUT NOT TO PRESSURE ANYONE FOR A BIGGER EFFORT THAN HE IS COMFORTABLE WITH. WE WOULD LIKE TO BETTER LAST YEAR'S RECORD SCORE AND OF COURSE WIN THE SS GAVEL, BUT CONTESTING SHOULD BE FUN FOR ALL, AND WE MUST SAVE SOME ENERGY AND GOODWILL FOR OUR ARRL DX EFFORT.

AT THE SEPT.4 BOD MEETING WE ADOPTED A POLICY TO SEEK TWO PAGES PER MONTH OF CONTEST-RELATED EQUIPMENT ADVERTIS-MENTS FOR THE JUG. IF SUCCESSFUL THIS WILL RELIEVE OUR VERY TIGHT BUDGET. THIS WAS THE RESULT OF A VERY GOOD TALK ON CLUB FUND RAISING BY BOB, K6SEM, PRESIDENT OF PAARA.

OUR CHRISTMAS ADWARDS BANQUET IS SET FOR SATURDAY, DEC.20, MOVED FROM DEC. 13 BECAUSE OF THE 10 METER CONTEST. THE LOCATION WILL BE THE IMPERIAL GARDENS IN LOS ALTOS WHERE WE HAVE HAD THE BANQUET FOR THE LAST TWO YEARS.

RULES

- 1. Register at desk, obtain your AUCTION LOT NUMBER or FLEA MARKET TABLE. Then bring your gear into the cafeteria. There will be monitors and hand trucks to help move your equipment into place.
- 2. Buyers must register for bidding during the AUCTION.
- 3. AUCTION lot numbers will be issued in sequence of registration and auctioned in that order.
- 4. CHARGES: 10 % of sale price of auctioned items will be retained by PAARA. If you buy back your own equipment, this fee applies, but subject to a \$5.00 maximum per item. Flea market tables are \$3.50 each.
- 5. LIMITS: Auction material will be limited to 5 lots per person the first time around. If time permits, additional material may be put up for auction.
- 6. IDENTIFICATION: In addition to his lot number, owner should attach information on material to be sold, such as:
 - a. Description of item, frequency range, power required, etc.
 - b. Condition of item: operating, needs repair, not known.
- 7. DONATIONS: Funds raised from donated equipment will help defray Club expenses.
- 8. DURING THE AUCTION: Buyers must show their registration number to record their purchase.
- 9. PAYING AND RECEIVING: Buyers and sellers will make their payment and collect money due at the TREASURER'S DESK. Buyers are urged to settle promptly after each purchase.

To reach AMPEX from BAYSHORE or EL CAMINO take WOODSIDE ROAD to BAY ROAD (located two blocks west of BAYSHORE), turn south four blocks to the AMPEX parking lot. The cafeteria is just south of Building No. 1.

HOW TO BEAT THE WINNERS BY LARRY LEKASHMAN, W910P

GETTING KNOWN AS A FACTOR: OPERATING CONSISISTENTLY THROUGH THE YEARS WILL WILL GIVE YOU AN ADVANTAGE OVER NEW COMPETITION. YOUR CALL BECOMES WELL KNOWN AND YOU DEVELOP A CERTAIN COM-RADSHIP WITH A SUBSTANTIAL NUMBER OF AMATEURS WHO "EXPECT" TO WORK YOU EVERY YEAR. THESE STATIONS ARE NOT, IN MOST INSTAMCES, OUT FOR LARGE SCORES AND WILL GO OUT OF THE WAY TO AFFECT A QSO WITH YOU, INCLUDING WAIT-ING PATIENTLY IF YOU ARE BUSY WITH A RUN OF CONTACTS. ADDITIONALLY, YOU RETAIN A SURPRISINGLY LARGE NUMBER OF CALLS IN YOUR SUBCONSCIOUS AND CAN CORRECTLY PICK OUT A STATION FROM A PRETTY IMPROBABLE MESS. READING A CALL BOOK WON'T BE THE LEAST HELP, BUT OPER-ATING IN A HALF A DOZEN OR SO CONTESTS WILL GIVE YOU A LIBRARY OF "REGULARS" THAT BECOME EASIER TO IDENTIFY AND WORK.

DESPITE THE EFFORT AND EXPENSE INVOLVED, IT IS A GOOD POLICY TO TRY TO QSL EACH SS CONTACT AT LEAST EVERY FEW YEARS. IT IS A COURTESY FOR ONE THING...IT INCREASES YOUR IDENTITY FACTOR WITH EVERYONE RECEIVING A CARD AND IF YOU HAVE SOME PATTERN TO YOUR CARDS, IT GIVES THE GANG ANOTHER REASON TO WANT A CONTACT.
