GREETINGS TO ALL MEMBERS! IT'S TIME TO SAY GOODBY TO THE 1980-81 CONTEST SEASON. LOOKING BACK, WE CAN SEE NEW RECORDS IN THE CAL QSO PARTY, ANOTHER EASY WIN IN THE SWEEPSTAKES (WE WON HANDILY BY 3.5 MILLION POINTS), SOME GOOD CONDITIONS AND BIG SCORES IN THE ARRL DX CONTEST, AND SOME NOTEWORTHY SCORES IN OTHER CONTESTS WHICH WERE NOT MAJOR CLUB EFFORTS. MANY KUDOS AND THANKS TO THE OUTGOING OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS FOR THEIR HARD WORK AND DETERMINAION.

IMMEDIATLY AHEAD OF US ARE THE WPX-CW CONTEST IN MAY, AND THE ALL ASIAN CONTEST AND FIELD DAY IN JUNE. LOOKING AHEAD FURTHER- THE FALL CONTEST SEASON TO BE EXACT- THERE ARE THE CQWW AND SS CONTESTS. 



#### VISALIA CONTEST FORUM AND CAC REPORTS

There was an excellent turnout of about 200 people for the Contest Forum AT THE DX CONVENTION IN VISALIA ON MAY 2. I TOOK A POLL ON THE CAC MAY BALLOT ITEMS, AND RESULTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. CHANGE IARU SCORING - NO.

2. MULTI-OP SS STATIONS 30 HRS. - NO

3. MULTI-OP SS STATIONS SEND M PREC - NO

4. Award top ten certificates in SS and DX - YES

5. AWARD "PARTICIPATION" CERTIFICATES - YES (SLIGHT MAJORITY)
6. MULTI-OPS INDICATE OPERATOR IN LOG - NO

7. TEN METER CONTEST MIXED MODE ONLY - NO

8. FIELD DAY DATE AS IS - YES

9. RETAIN FIELD DAY BATTERY CATEGORY - YES

A FEW ITEMS WERE SUBMITTED FOR CAC CONSIDERATION AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. ELIMINATE THE CURRENT "TWO TRANSMITTER" MULTI-SINGLE CATEGORY (ALLOW ONE TRANSMITTER, PERIOD), AND CLEARLY DEFINE THE TEN MINUTE RULE SO THAT THERE IS NO CONFUSION.
- 2. Define the penalty system for score reduction, and guidelines used TO VALIDATE A QSO.
- 3. Consider establishing a separate single operator category for super-STATIONS AND/OR GUEST (HIRED GUN) OPERATORS.
- 4. Devise a way (signing portable again?) to eliminate the confusion ABOUT THE LOCATION OF A STATION WHICH IS NOT OPERATING WHERE YOU MIGHT THINK (E.G., A KH6 IN CT OR A W1 IN NV, ETC.).




