CONTEST TRADITION REVEALED!!!

After much arm-twisting, the heretofore closely guarded secret recipe for Rolling Thunder Chili is now disclosed!

Rolling Thunder Chili

- 3 large onions, peeled
- 2 green peppers, cut into large chunks
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
 - 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1-1/2 pounds Italian sausage
 - 2 cans (1 pound, 12 ounces each)
 Italian whole tomatoes, drained
 - 2 cans (15 ounces each) kidney beans, drained
 - 1 can (15 ounces) tomato sauce
 - 2 cups Zinfandel (red wine)
 - 2 tablespoons chopped fresh basil or 2 teaspoons dried
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon fresh ground pepper
 - 1/2 teaspoon fresh-grated parmesan cheese

Halve onions and slice thin. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, saute onions with peppers and garlic in olive oil until light brown. Transfer to a large kettle, and set aside.

Saute whole Italian sausages, in skins, until very lightly browned. Remove sausage from skillet and slice into 1/4-inch pieces, removing skins if desired. Add sausage to kettle. Stir in tomatoes, kidney beans, tomato sauce, wine, herbs, salt, and pepper. Simmer 1 to 2 hours until thickened.

Stir in parmesan cheese just before serving.

Makes 8 servings.


