QRM AND QRN...

As of January 31, 1988, the 17 Meter band is available to U.S. amateurs. For those who don't know, it is between 20 and 15 meters. This band is only 100 khz wide. Amateur allocations are from 18.068 Mhz to 18.168 Mhz. Why are the band edges the way they are is beyond normal human thought. This band should provide some relief for chronic ragchewers that populate the 20 meter band during a contest weekend. ARRL adopted a "standard" band plan for this new band. FSK and other digital modes can be used from 18.068 to 18.110 and SSB and SSTV from 18.110 to 18.168. There are no plans at this time to use this new band for contests or award chasing. This makes the future of this band rather bleak in light of the 220 Mhz affair.

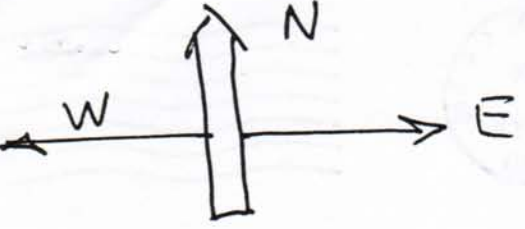
