NCCC MINUTES October 20, 1989

The October 20, 1989 meeting of the NCCC was called to order by AI6V at 7:55 p.m. at Miguel's Restaurant in Hayward. Fourteen members and guests were in attendance.

W6OAT was recruited to perform Secretarial duties for the evening. Minutes of the September meeting were approved as published in The Jug.

Al Crespo, WR6R, was reinstated as an NCCC member upon payment of dues.

Members recapped their California QSO Party experiences and results, and forecast plans for the upcoming CQ WW SSB DX Contest.

W6OAT led a discussion of Sweepstakes operating practices and strategy. While we hope most NCCC members will participate in the SS, we suspect that we will compete in the "Medium Club" category rather than in the "Unlimited" class.

W6OAT reported on the status of several cases involving attempts by local amateurs to get permission from their respective city governments to install antennas. The conclusion is that some cities are being quite creative in their attempts to frustrate the dictates of PRB-1, and that we amateurs still have to overcome opposition from many openly-hostile local governments.

By 9:45, the meeting had evolved into numerous bull sessions and discussions of how various people fared in the October 17th earthquake. It all came to a close when the Miguel's staff hinted we should leave or else join the ethnic wedding party going on elsewhere in their establishment.
