The club has received copies of Dave Pruett's computer logging program. Dave has asked us to distribute it freely to interested parties. If you would like a copy, send an empty formatted floppy disk to Phil, K6ZM, or to Alex, K16EZ. Dave described his software on page 21 of the November/December issue of the National Contest Journal:

"For many years, I was an opponent of real-time computer logging, arguing that the computer would just get in my way and that there was no room on my desk.

"All that was changed by one man and his software: Ken Wolff, K1EA and his program, CT, for the CQWW, ARRL DX, CQ WPX, and WAE contests. Ken was the first to successfully combine the logging, duping, multiplier checking and CW sending functions into one tool which enhanced, not hindered, the operator...

"My conversion to computer logging was so total that I did not chernd ARRL Sweepstakes.

[The version we have also includes ARRL and CQ 160 meter contests and the ARRL 10 meter contest. -N6EK]
