NCDXCC, but instead will only explain to

you where we are. This year in the ARRL DX, the NCCC will submit its own entry--the NCDXCC will not be used. The primary reason behind this decision is that the ARRL will be (hopefully) deciding on proposals affecting club competition at the January Directors meeting, which at this time appears to be in a state of limbo. We have achieved a good understanding regarding clubs with our newly-elected representatives W6ZM and W6JZU, but our recommendations have yet to be presented in January. Of prime interest will be the reaction of our proposal to allow a person who is a bona-fide and active member of more than one club to submit his score for those clubs. During this interim time period, the NCDXCC will receive its own directors who are not those who must run the NCCC and NCDXC. These directors will make the appropriate effort for the NCDXCC and probably determine its destin-

Operations during the ARRL DX will be carried out in typical KB fashion. We should use the repeater, and the organization of the repeater will be the job of the new directors of the NCDXCC. A similar Area Co-ordinator for the ARRL DX will be used, but in a lower-key fashion than the SS. Our end goal is to be a top contender by 1980. This means a lot of DX-learning, planning, and people-co-operation. With the normal attitude of the NCCC and improved conditions by 1980, our goal seems to be within our reach.

Appropriate awards and trophies are also in the planning stages for the ARRL DX. We will accept all your ideas for consideration. The Fresno Convention awards are also being discussed with the leadership of the NCDXC. Please be assured that our friends in the NCDXC are really that—our friends. They are interested in many of the same things we are, and have the same desires, too—to enjoy amateur radio and good friends.

Again, best wishes in the New Year, and see you at the January meeting.

CONTEST CORNER'S CHAIRMAN

First off, I would like to wish every-Le a Happy New Year for 1978. And now I turn my attention to the upcoming DX contest season. The first installment of the ARRL DX Competition occurs on February 4th. The BoD, after thinking over all the options, has decided that we shall submit our scores in the name of the NCCC. Use of the NCDXCC was decided against at a meeting of the NCDXCC Board in early January. This does not mean that the Co-operative is dead, however. It just won't be used in ARRL DX this year.

A maximum effort by the NCCC is planned, although planning and organization is not nearly as massive as it was for SS. All stations are encouraged to participate. Through volunteer help and the efforts of the BoD, we will try to direct the operation and match up stations and operators. Use of the WR6ACZ repeater by dual members is encouraged, and non-members are invited to listen and submit DX information if not already announced. I will try to have log, check, and summary sheets at the January and

"abruary meetings.

Here's the deal. We have developed the winning formula for domestic contests and have proven our might in three successive SS contests. Now it's time to start playing for the really big marbles, namely the DX contests. Each year we gain more experience and confidence in DX contesting. The limiting factor seems to be propagation, and it is only a matter of time before conditions will favor the West Coast. Thus, this is the time to practice and build up our skill and stations for DX-type competition.

The hour of glory is not far off. We wait, and practice, and train for the moment when our combined power is sent forth to attack and defeat our rivals. Northern California, DX Champions:

Take this opportunity in the coming months of February and March to increase your ability and effectiveness in DX contesting by participating in the ARRL DX tests.

Don't forget the January CQ 160 Meter CW Contest, 2200Z January 27th to 1600Z on January 29th.

The NCCC Maxi-Test is back. This sea-Son the Maxi will be a year-long event with one contest each month (except in November). I am preparing a letter to be sent to all of the active contest clubs explaining the Maxi-Test. Basically, the

test is an hour-long event beginning at 6:30 p.m. PST (0230Z) on the second Tuesday of the month. The Maxi precedes the regular NGCC Net on 3815 kHz, the modes alternating between phone and CW each month. The contest ends at 7:30 p.m. (0330Z). It is open to all amateurs in the U.S. and Canada, and Club competition is promoted.

Contest exchange is RST, consecutive serial number, and ARRL section or country. A station may be worked once on each amateur band 160-20 meters for QSO points, but multipliers count only once. Multipliers are ARRL and Canadian sections -- a total of 75. DX contacts count for QSO points but not for multipliers.

Scoring: QSO totals from the four bands times unique sections worked. Report scores to N6TU on 3815 after the contest, or by mail before the following

Tuesday.

Entrants participate from February to October, and in December. Add scores from each month to get the final total for the year. First, 2nd, and 3rd places in the NCCC and 1st. 2md. and 3rd out-ofclub will get certificates. The Club competition winner will receive a trophy. The Northern California Contest Club will accept challenges from other clubs.

The January Maxi will be a warm-up, CW, to be held on Tuesday, January 24th.
