Hey, guess what? I think we can win this contest!
We're now Just a week and a half away from the SSB portion of the 1981 CQ World WIde DX Competition. And, by all indications, NCCC is ready to roll. Between the two weekends, here in Club territory, there'11 be 39 mult1-operatop efforts, along with 73 single-op, all-band entries. In addition, at least 19 contest DXpeditions will contribute to the NCCC total. All in all, we should have no trouble in reaching our club goal of 200 Megapoints.

Here's how you can help. If you're going single-op for the contest, shoot for at least 500,000 points. It takes just 700 Q Sos and 250 country/ zone multipliers to make that kind of score. And it's easy to do. Just run JAs at one-a-minute for 10 hours, and look around the bands for multipliers, especially for Europeans on 10,15 , and 20 meters. Once you've reached that Initial 500 Kllopolnt goal--Gon't stop! Just keep climbing those golden stairs!

If you're operating in the multi-operator category for the World Wide, go for a score of 2 Megapoints. This comes out to 1,800 psis and 400 multipliers. You may have to work hard to attain such a score, but it' 11 be a job well done. If we can average 500 K with our single-op entries and 2 M with our multi-op ones, and if our contest expeditions average 4.5 Megapoints apiece,

The DX spotilng net wlll be in full operation during both veekends of the CQ contest. It w111 be held on the NCDXC repeater, WRGAC2, 147.96/.36. KNGK is co-ordinat Ing the net for the 5SB weekend, and K6HNz is handling the Ch net. Here's how it works, When you contact a cholce DX atation or a good multiplier, oneck 1nto the net, giving the Net Control Station (NCS) the following information: 1) the band; 2) the callalgn, phonetically; 3) the frequency; and 4) youe call. It'a very important that you follow the "band/ DX call/frequency/your call" format when reporting into the spotting net. $A B$ an example, you would say, "On 15 meters, 5 Hotel 3 Tango Kextco, 21293, from Wbila,"

Eyery quanter hour the NCS will come on with a summsry of what was reportied In the past 15 minutes and where it. is on the band. Itis a great way to have about 100 palrs of eara working for you to make aure that you son't miga anythine during the contest. Since the effective use of the spotting net culminates in Ilterally milliona of points toward our club total, I encourape every station to usf the net. In past DX contests, we've had some prohlems, especially among our big multimultis, with stations that take from the met,
but don't feed it with quitipliers. Rememher, we're not competing agalnst each other. We're competing amaInat the East Coast. And if we takf without flving, it could mean the difference between an NCCC win in the CQ World Wide--and an HCCC loss. So, please feed the net, as well as takink from it. If you're toing single-op for the conteat, you might want to consider using the net anyway. It w111 put you in the multi-single oategory in the CQ Magazine final results, but it's a great way to add oountrles to your multiplier total. And you'11 st 111 be considered single-operator for all NCCG awards. The AWards Committee (headed up by W6SzN) and the NCCC ChWN Planning Committee have come up with a dynamite awards program for this year's CQ :
