News From the YASME Foundation

January 10 1988 Kathmandu, Nepal

Dear Friends:

Our YASME operation as 9N5QL lasted from 27 December 1987 through 7 January 1988. We made 3,500 QSO's, half phone and half CW, on 28 mc through 7 mc. Hams were contacted in 121 countries.

We were restricted as to frequencies and time of operation, but it did not seriously interfere with the operation. We were very lucky to obtain permission to operate, which was especially granted in honor of the King of Nepal's birthday. There are only two permanent hams in Nepal, Father Moran, 9NlMM, and Chief Radio Engineer Krishna Khatry, 9NlMC. A group of amateurs from Japan operated as 9N7YDY during part of the time that we were there. All of the hams listed were a great help and helped us install and make repairs to our station.

We had one of our all-time lucky breaks. We arrived past midnight and asked a taxi cab driver to take us to a hotel. He did not know that we were radio amateurs and neither did the hotel managers. When we awoke in the morning, we found that we were in a room on the top fourth floor all by itself, and on the roof above, an additional floor with a sun-deck about 10' x 10' with regular stairs leading to it. It was a magnificent place for our beam. We could have searched for a month and not found a better QTH located on a high place in the center of Kathmandu in the Himalayan Mountains.

There is no QSL bureau in Nepal, so all QSL's should go to the YASME Foundation.

No host cocktails will begin at 6:30 p.m. with dinner at 7:30 p.m. Number of attendees to be submitted three days prior to meeting. The program will be by AI6V, N6KT and others on the P4OV expedition.

The Election Nominating Committee, consisting of W6OAT and K6ZM, is to report at the next BOD meeting the results of their search for new officers. As possible candidates the following were mentioned: AI6V, K6KLY, WZ6Z, NV6Z, N1EE, N6EK, K6XO, WA0YQM, N6VV, KA6ING.

NV6Z will look for a place to hold the election. It was suggested that a pizza parlor with a closed room could be found. Ron will report at the next BOD meeting.

It was unanimously agreed to sponsor a Hospitality Suite at the Visalia Convention.

WZ6Z has prepared a questionnaire concerning the Club which is to be reviewed at the February BOD meeting and inserted in the February Jug.

The meeting was adjourned at 22:15 p.m., local time.


